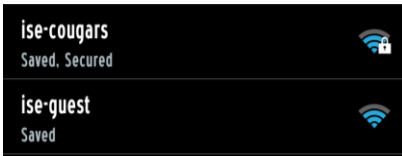


## Connecting an Android Phone to the Wireless Network for the first time

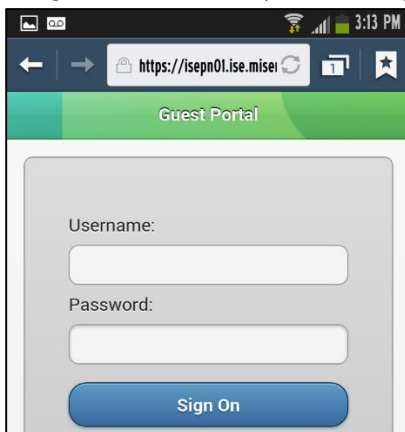
1. Go to the Settings icon on your Android device.
2. Click on Wi-Fi option.



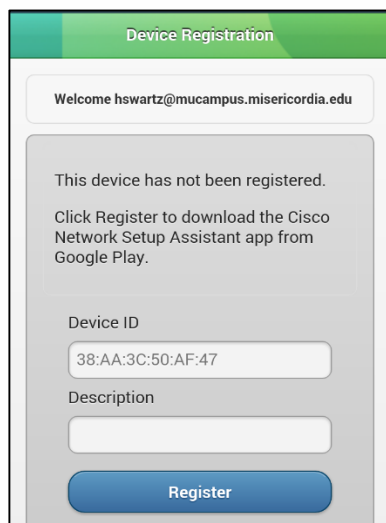
3. Choose the **mu-guest** network to connect to.

**NOTE:** The names of the networks in the picture are incorrect. The name of the network will be **mu-guest**.

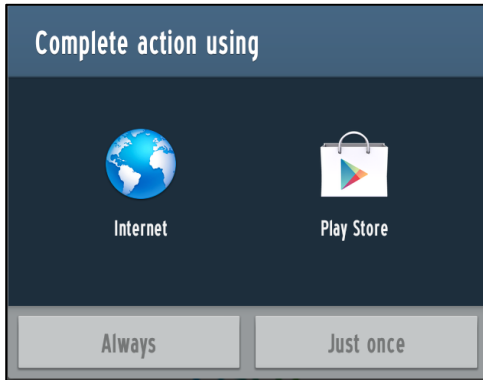
4. Open the Internet icon on your home screen.
5. A log in window will open. Enter your e-MU credentials and tap Sign on.



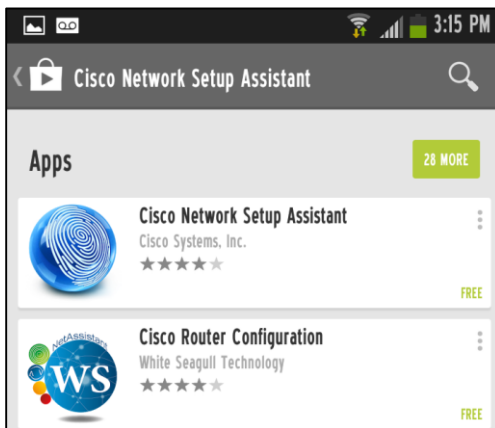
6. A device registration page will open. This will automatically enter the MAC address of your Android phone.



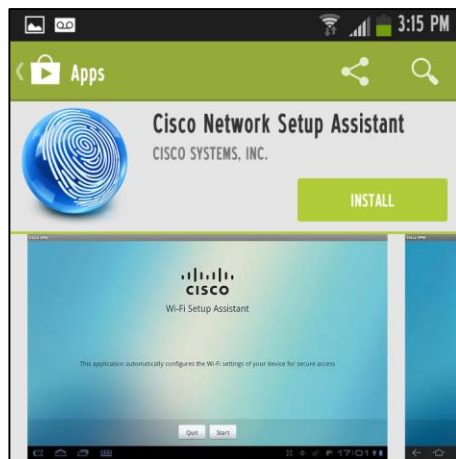
7. Enter a meaningful description such as Mike Smith's Android.
8. Tap the Register button.
9. You will be prompted to install the Cisco Network Setup Assistant from the Internet or the Google Play Store.



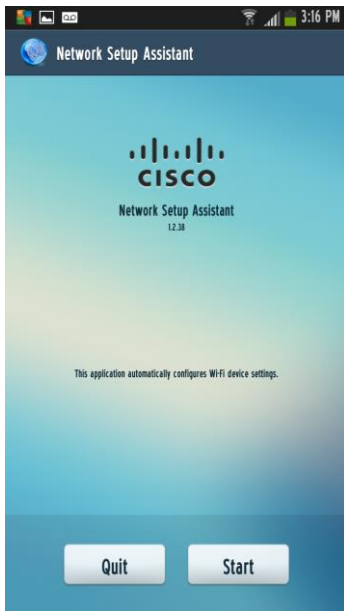
10. Choose the Play Store and either Always or Just once depending on how you want to install apps in the future.
11. Select the Cisco Network Setup Assistant app.



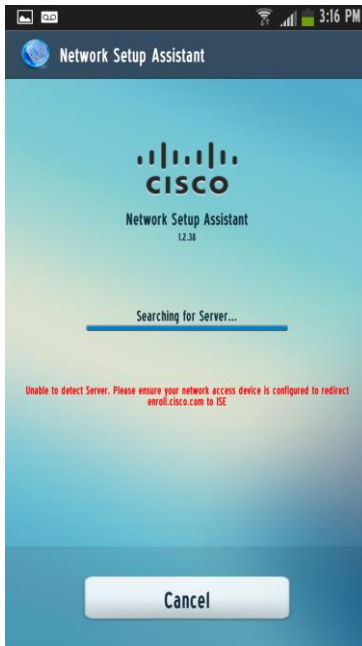
12. Tap Install.



13. Once the install is complete the Cisco Network Assistant will prompt you to begin setup. Tap Start.



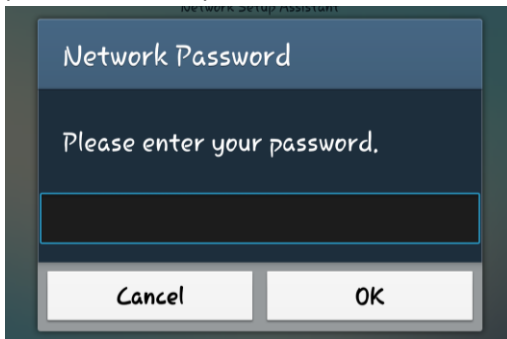
14. The setup will fail.



15. Tap Cancel.

16. Open the Cisco Network Setup Assistant and try again. Tap Start to begin.

17. You will be prompted for your W-Fi account password. This is your e-MU password. Enter your password and tap Next.



18. The Setup Assistant will run and connect you to the **Cougars** wireless network.
