Class rank in the top half of the high school
graduating class and/or a cumulative 2.5
grade point average

Minimum combined SAT score of 850 for
Critical Reading and Math (combined) if
taken prior to March 5, 2016, or 930 if taken
after March 5, 2016. In lieu of the SAT, ACT
results may be presented with a minimum
required composite score of 18.

Please note the above listed requirements
are general, and that each application is
looked at thoroughly, taking into account
individual grades, academic rigor, and
other factors. A number of academic

GUARANTEED PLACEMENT PROGRAM

The Guaranteed Placement Program (GPP) is a career development program designed to supplement a student's formal education.

Established in 1999, the GPP integrates classroom instruction, experiential education, service leadership, and career focused workshops. The program is designed to prepare students looking to enter the workforce or graduate school after graduation and is facilitated through workshops and individual appointments.

Our guarantee states that if any student, who fully participates in our program for all four years of their college experience, does not receive a job offer or is not accepted into graduate/professional school within six months of graduation, the University provides that student a paid internship* in their chosen field.
