Head Men's Basketball Coach Willie Chandler

Willie Chandler is in his fourth season as head men's basketball coach at Misericordia University.

A member of the Misericordia Athletics Hall of Fame, Chandler has served as an assistant coach at his alma mater for the last six years.

Chandler was a four-time Pennsylvania Athletic Conference Player of the Year and ended his career as the second-leading scorer in NCAA D-III history with 2,898 points.

He was a three-time All-American and led the nation in scoring twice and spent five seasons playing professionally in Europe, South American and United States Basketball League.

Chandler led the Cougars to four consecutive post-season appearances, including one trip to the PAC championship game.

Chandler, who earned a bachelor's degree in business administration, holds nine school career records and five school single-game records.

He was a four-time Misericordia/Wendy's Athlete of the Year.
